Project Description:	Operation of a Gamma Knife center at the Peruvian Air Force Hospital in Lima that will provide detection and treatment of tumors in both military personnel and the general public.

Policy Review	
Developmental Effects:	The Project will have a positive developmental impact on the host country. It will have positive technology and knowledge transfer benefits by utilizing new medical technologies and offering new services in the host country. Gamma Knife Lima will establish a brain cancer treatment facility for middle and high-income patients. This service is currently unavailable in Peru. The project will promote private sector development in Peru through local procurement. The project will also offer employee benefits and will produce positive fiscal benefits and foreign exchange earnings in Peru.
Environment:	The Project has been screened as Category B because it involves medical services having some potential health and environmental impacts that can be mitigated to acceptable levels by the adoption of good management practices (GMP). Medical services facilities have the potential to cause minor environmental impacts. However, these impacts can be readily mitigated to acceptable levels through the implementation of specified environmental controls. The implementation of proposed environmental health and safety management measures are expected to result in compliance with IFC's General EHS Guidelines. In addition, the Project is expected to comply with the international standards for the safe operation of medical equipment.
Workers Rights:	OPIC's statutorily required worker rights language will be supplemented with provisions concerning the right of association, organization and collective bargaining, hours of work, minimum wage, timely payment of wages, minimum age and hazardous work conditions. Standard and supplemental contract language will be applied to all workers of the project.
Human Rights:	This project received a human rights clearance on July 9, 2010
