

## INFORMATION SUMMARY FOR THE PUBLIC

<b>Host Country:</b>	India
<b>Name of Borrower:</b>	QuantumID Technologies (India) Pvt. Ltd., (“QID(India)”), a limited liability company organized and existing in India. (the “Borrower”) and directly owned 98% by QuantumID Technologies Inc. (“QID”), 1% by Milind Tavshikar, and 1% by Prasanna Gogwekar.
<b>U.S. Sponsors:</b>	Milind Tavshikar is a U.S. citizen who directly and indirectly owns 36% of the Borrower; RFID LLC , is a Delaware corporation which indirectly owns 36% of Borrower; RFID3 LLC, is a Delaware corporation which indirectly owns 10% of Borrower; Prasanna Gogwekar, a U.S. citizen who directly and indirectly owns 3% of Borrower; RFID2 LLC, is a Delaware corporation which indirectly owns 2% of Borrower; and 10% ownership of Borrower is unallocated for citizens of United States which is currently directly owned by QID.
<b>Foreign Sponsors:</b>	Ruaidhri O’Connor, a citizen of Ireland, who owns 1% of the Borrower; Simon Yang, a citizen of Australia, who owns 1% of Borrower; and 1% ownership of Borrower is unallocated for citizens of India which is currently directly owned by QID.
<b>Project Description:</b>	Fund the Borrower’s development and expansion of RFID (Radio Frequency Identification) tracking and tracing systems business for the airline cargo/courier industry throughout India.
<b>Total Project Costs:</b>	\$5,000,000
<b>Proposed OPIC Loan:</b>	\$3,000,000, for up to 5-years total term, including a 9-month grace period on principal.
<b>Developmental Effects:</b>	Project qualifies at the upper end of the <i>developmental</i> range with score of 98.5. This project will have a positive developmental impact in India by improving the efficiency of the local airline and cargo industries. The project’s technology reduces theft in transit, lowers the frequency of cargo misrouting, and increases the speed of operations. The project introduces new cargo tracking and scanning technology to the market, as well as modern management techniques. The project will have strong human capacity building impacts in India through the creation of professional employment opportunities that include benefits and formal training, some of which will take place in the United States.
<b>Environment:</b>	Screened as Category C under OPIC’s environmental guidelines.
<b>Worker Rights:</b>	OPIC’s statutorily required standard worker rights language will be supplemented with provisions concerning the right of association, organization and collective bargaining, minimum age, hours of work, timely payment of wages, minimum wages, and hazardous working conditions. Standard and supplemental contract language will be applied to all workers of the Project.
<b>Human Rights:</b>	The project received U.S. State Department Human Rights Clearance on August 27, 2010.
