Developmental Effects:	<p>This Project is expected to have positive developmental impact on Georgia by supporting an international development organization that promotes local economic development, youth engagement, cross border corporation, independent media and public policy. The Foreign Enterprise provides building capacity for evidence-based research to improve public policy making and technical assistance to NGOs and civil society organizations (CSOs) in marketing their services to local constituencies. The Foreign Enterprise's charitable activities include a youth integration program that recruit youth volunteers and develop their capacity to identify, fund and oversee small projects initiated by their peers.</p>
Environment:	<p>The Project has been reviewed against OPIC's categorical prohibitions and has been determined to be categorically eligible. Projects that involve providing technical, operational and financial assistance are screened as Category C for the purposes of environmental and social assessment. Negative environmental, health, safety and social impact concerns are expected to be minimal. The key environmental and social issues of concern include the need for the Foreign Enterprise to have a social and environmental policy in place and a grievance mechanism developed in accordance with IFC's Performance Standards.</p>

<p>Worker Rights</p>	<p>OPIC's statutorily required standard worker rights language will be supplemented with provisions concerning the right of association, organization and collective bargaining. Standard and supplemental contract language will be applied to all workers of the Project. The Project will be required to operate in a manner consistent with the requirements of the International Finance Corporation's Performance Standard 2 on Labor and Working Conditions.</p>
<p>Human Rights</p>	<p>OPIC issued a human rights clearance for the Project on March 26, 2015.</p>
<p>U.S. Effects</p>	<p>The Foreign Enterprise supports programs that promote local economic development, youth engagement and cross border cooperation services and thus is not expected to have a negative impact on U.S. employment. As a non-profit development organization, the Project is not expected to generate capital reflows to the United States. Thus, the Project is expected to have a negative impact on the U.S. balance of payments over the first five years.</p>
